Intellectual Property Rights and Copyright

Stardom University

Intellectual property rights

Stardom University values and respects intellectual property rights, including copyright, design rights, patent rights, and source code licenses for software and documentation associated with its information systems. All material published on the university's portal, electronic systems, and affiliated websites, including text, graphics, images, programs, designs, files, or other materials, is subject to intellectual property rights. It is prohibited to include any published material that violates the intellectual property rights of any entity or person on the university's portal or electronic systems.

Written permission must be obtained for any public use of materials published on the university's website, except as permitted by intellectual property law, as stated in this policy, and the intellectual property rights statement on the portal. We emphasize the importance of citing or using any material published on the portal.

Violation of any person's or company's copyright, patent, or other intellectual property rights or similar laws and regulations is prohibited, including, without limitation, the installation of unauthorized or illegal software on University systems or other systems not belonging to Stardom University but connected to the University's IT environment.

- The Deanship of Information Technology must maintain appropriate information on licenses, terms and conditions relating to its critical information systems.
- The use of unlicensed software or intellectual property is strictly prohibited.



Copyright Policy

The electronic portal and systems must be used for the benefit of the university, its students, its affiliates, and its various sectors, and in a manner that does not conflict with regulations and laws that expose them to legal accountability. Therefore, it is important to ensure that publishing policies are followed. All content published on the electronic content and website must comply with the university's copyright and electronic publishing policy, including:

- Audio and video lessons and lectures.
- Books and publications available in electronic format.
- Any electronic material that infringes intellectual property rights.

In addition, we emphasize the following points:

- Appropriate approvals must be obtained before posting any content on the University Portal to ensure compliance with copyright laws.
- The University encourages all individuals to report any violations of intellectual property rights that they observe.
- The University reserves the right to edit or remove any content that violates its publishing policies and intellectual property rights without prior notice.
